RESOLUTION NO. 21-018

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA TO SET THE TAX REQUEST FOR THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR OCTOBER 1, 2021 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2022.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA:

WHEREAS Neb. Rev. Stat. § 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the City Council of the City of Plattsmouth passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount;

WHEREAS a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the final tax request for the fiscal year October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022;

WHEREAS it is in the best interests of the City of Plattsmouth that the amount of the property tax request for the current fiscal year be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year;

WHEREAS, the amount of the property tax requested for the current fiscal year is \$1,540,250;

WHEREAS, the total assessed value of the property in the current fiscal year differs from the total assessed value of the prior fiscal year by an increase of 9.26%;

WHEREAS, the tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as the last fiscal year, when applied to the total assessed value of the property in the current fiscal year, would be \$.449715 per \$100 of assessed value;

WHEREAS, the City of Plattsmouth proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate for the current fiscal year to be \$.449715 per \$100 of assessed value; and

WHEREAS, the proposed change in the property tax request and the other changes in revenue will cause the total operating budget of the current fiscal year to exceed the total operating budget of the prior fiscal year by 7.18 percent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following tax levy is adopted for the fiscal year October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022 with a dollar requirement totaling \$1,540,250 based on a combined tax rate of \$.449715 per \$100.00 of taxable valuation as follows: (1) a rate of \$.033284 per \$100.00 of valuation for the bond levy in the total amount of \$113,995 and (2) a rate of \$.416432 per \$100.00 of valuation for general operating expenses in the total amount of \$1,426,255 (consisting of \$.322966 per \$100.00 of valuation for general operating expenses in the total amount of \$1,106,140 and \$.093466 per \$100.00 of valuation for other debt service in the total amount of \$320,115).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth

adopt a property tax request different than the amount of the tax request for the prior year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed on behalf of the City of Plattsmouth to certify the tax request and dollar requirements to the County Board and County Clerk of Cass County, Nebraska, and is further directed to file or cause the same to be filed with the State Auditor of Public Accounts, on or before September 20, 2021.
